We have had 12 children in our care for the past 14 months. I stand amazed at how these children have been rescued from very sad situations and too see how they have developed and how the Foster Mothers look after them and love them unconditionally. The amazing thing is how the children have responded to love, care and nourishment. They have all grown over the year and are a group of happy children. All praise goes to the Lord for what He has done. These homes did not have a sponsor for the

The teams that they sent out in 2012 were just wonderful. They came and helped us with the interior of the home. Some of the team members returned the second time in the year. The Lord has been give us wonderful people to work alongside of me.

I continue to mentor a group of Xhosa speaking pastors. We have been meeting together for years and it has been a great blessing each week as we come to share in their joys and sorrows. I have learnt to rejoice with those who rejoice and weep with those that weep. Our weekly meetings have been a source of both strength and encouragement.

The church plants have showed continual growth for which I am thankful to the Lord. Pastor Eric works in an area called Amalinda Forest. There he pastors a church and his wife Ann runs a pre-school on the property. This past year she had 125 children in their care. They received an award of Excellency from the local governance. Together they put in long hours for which I am grateful for. Praise the Lord, one of their daughters has graduated from University as a social worker. Pastor James continues to prove his calling into the ministry. He has faced many challenges.

One of James's sons is now entering his final year at university. The rest of the family are doing well. His wife, who is bi-polar, has been doing very well over the past 4 yrs. The pre-school continues to be a blessing to the children of the local community. The Home care for Aids patients continues to prove a blessing and can also be a great challenge.

Pastor Nicholas who is bi-vocational, continues to work in Khayaletsha. This work has grown and the shack church that they meet in is far too small. I was with them this morning in worship. The Temp was 110 deg F and the humidity 90 %. It was so uncomfortable to worship but the presence of God was ever so present. We have been waiting now for 7 years to purchase a piece of Land. But it is long process and I trust that we will be able to build a church there by this time next year.

The work in Biko Village, Lord willing, will start in Jan 2013. Pastor Philemon has completed his studies and I would like to see him work at Gilgal Church and Biko village. He is looking forward to get going in ministry. Before he is appointed He will need financial support.
