Under Pauline's leadership, the AIDS hospice is making a huge difference for many of the patients who have been referred to stay there.

There are three main challenges now:

- Funding
- Space
- Personnel

Although the cost per patients is extremely low

compared to any other facility of similar standard, thanks to the several volunteers staff and food donations, there is a great need for ongoing operation cost support.

Extra beds are now installed, so 8 patients can stay there now.

Staffing 24/7 is often a challenge, especially for the nights.

CHURCH PLANT IN BIKO PROPOSED

"The local community council may agree to make a building [for a church plant] available".

As mentioned in the lead story on the first page, Pastor Philemon hopes to start several new church plants with his Gilgal congregation as a mother base. The first of these is in Biko, where the local community council may agree to make a building available. It is an old structure, once used for housing. A part is currently used for a preschool. The main issue: No roof! Of

course, there are more things to fix to enable people to gather there, not the least proper toilets for children, men and women.

Overwhelming Needs

With unemployment rate about 80% in the local townships, rampant AIDS epidemic, high crime rates and huge numbers of abandoned children it is easy to become numb to the needs of the people. When Jesus saw the crowds of needy people, what did He do? It says in Matt 9: 35-38 that He had

compassion on them. Do we share this compassion for the crowds that we see daily in the townships?

With such small resources that we have, are we having any impact on the lives of the needy people? We are reminded of the story about the little boy who was throwing into the ocean some starfish that were washed up onto a beach. A stranger told him that they will die anyway before you can get them all. The boy threw one into the water and said: "Sir, I made a difference for that one!" Let's make a difference, one at a time!

Preschool News

About 150 children are now attending the three preschools served by the Mission. At the Amalinda Forest school, new requirements with regards to toilet facilities have been issued. The smallest children must now have a separate facility. Plans are being made to implement it with support from one US donor church.

At Kayalitscha, the need is even greater, as the only

toilet does no longer have a door attached to it!

Parents prefer to send their children to the Mission schools rather than any government funded school because the kids are better cared for. A strong testimony to the love and dedication by the teachers!

A large grocery store now donates bread and cakes every two weeks for the schools and that is a great help and a blessing.

At this time we are awaiting the Kayalitscha community leaders to decide about the land needed for proper school and church construction. Please pray for this situation!

Reaching the Xhosas with God's Good News

Pastor Dennis (affectionately known as "Hoppy") Pohlmann has reached out to the poor townships near his South African pastorates since 1980. Although the government is making strenuous efforts to lift the living standards, many squatters are moving to the more densely populated areas in the hope of finding jobs and health care, overwhelming the local municipal resources. Hoppy's current outreach is in the East London, Eastern Cape, area in South Africa. He is the pastor of Amalinda Baptist Church, which has a growing attendance of multicultural people, while mentoring several Xhosa pastors. Our mission is to reach the Xhosa population with the Gospel, by making church and school facilities available in township settlements, and proclaiming the Gospel.

Dr. Bo Arvidson is the US coordinator of this mission support and can be reached as seen on top left. Kurt Mälzer is active in Georgia, coordinating local support efforts there.

WHAT'S NEXT?

Check out the web site! It is updated at least once per month A 19 member college group from ????? Is coming in a three weeks to start some painting work in the Gilgal church building and then continue with several outreaches to public schools.

Another group from a church in North Carolina will come in July to continue with construction work. Funds are being raised to cover some of the local material costs.

As mentioned about the Amalinda Forest preschool, construction a separate toilet will need to begin shortly.

We hope to get information soon about the land for a school and a church building in Kayalitscha.

We are also awaiting to hear about the Biko building availability for a church plant.

Pastors James and Philemon are teaming up with Pastor Precious in a renewed effort to support a church plant in Reeston. A tent campaign is being organized.
